Edwardsville High School(EHS) is located in a suburban area of Illinois 15 miles northeast of St. Louis, Missouri. Many District 7 residents work in the St. Louis metropolitan area, and many of those are employed by technology companies, such as Boeing or Conoco Phillips, or by the large number of medical research institutions in our area. Southern Illinois University Edwardsville(SIUE), which sits on 2,660 acres on the western edge of Edwardsville, is the area's largest employer and serves a student population of nearly 13,000 students. Lewis & Clark Community College(L&C), based in Godfrey, IL, has a prominent campus in Edwardsville as well.

EHS serves approximately 2,400 students and is fully accredited by the Illinois State Board of Education. Over half of the 150+ professional staff members hold a Master's Degree or above. The school curriculum offers over 180 courses, including applied technology courses, 16 AP courses, and 30+ honors courses. EHS has developed a partnership with L&C to offer dual credit classes.

Class Rank

Edwardsville High School uses a four-point weighted system in computing a student's grade point average. Rank is based on all subject areas, except for physical education and driver education. All courses at EHS are based on a four-point system, except for those designated as honors courses, which are based on a five-point system.

Of the 589 EHS graduates in May of 2021, approximately 95% attend either two- or four-year colleges and universities. The remaining 5% attend vocational school, serve in the military, or work.

The Music Department-which includes band, orchestra, and vocal music-sent more students to the All-State music festival than any other school.

About District 7

Edwardsville Community Unit School District 7 is located in southwestern Illinois, approximately 15 miles northeast of St. Louis, Missouri. The District has a population of more than 35,000; covers 185 square miles; and encompasses two suburban communities, several small towns, and a large, unincorporated rural area within its boundaries. It is home to Southern Illinois University Edwardsville and the Lewis & Clark Community College N.O. Nelson Campus.

District 7's reputation for educational excellence has made it the district of choice in the Metro East area. Many of the surrounding communities, particularly in Madison County, have lost population in recent years. The District's continued growth has resulted from people moving here from neighboring communities and from those who are transfers into the St. Louis area. Area realtors steer their clients to the Edwardsville/Glen Carbon area because of its reputation as a strong community with an equally strong school system.

District 7 has a total enrollment of approximately 7,500 students, an increase of over 3,000 students since 1984.
