

### Q1: In which grades were your children enrolled this past spring? Select all that apply.










#### Q5: How many days a week was your child engaged in remote learning?




### Q12: Do you plan to have your student ride the bus to school in the morning?


#### Q13: Do you plan to have your student ride the bus in the afternoon?
